I. THE PATH TO SUFFERING Mark 10:32



- A. THE PASSOVER** - “And they were in the way”
- B. THE PROGRESS** – “going up”
- C. THE PLACE** – “to Jerusalem”
- D. THE PRIVACY** – “and Jesus went before them:”
- E. THE PUZZLEMENT** - “and they were amazed;”
- F. THE PURSUIT** – “and as they followed,”
- G. THE PHOBIAS** – “they were afraid.”
- H. THE PAUSE** – “And he took again the twelve,”
- I. THE PREPARATION** – “and began to tell them”
- J. THE PARTICULARS** – “what things should happen unto him,”

Three times Jesus predicts His death & Resurrection



- **At Caesarea Philippi**

And he began to teach them, that the Son of man must suffer many things, and be rejected of the elders, and of the chief priests, and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again (Mark 8:31).

- **After the Transfiguration**

And as they came down from the mountain, he charged them that they should tell no man what things they had seen, till the Son of man were risen from the dead (Mark 9:9).

And he answered and told them, Elias verily cometh first, and restoreth all things; and how it is written of the Son of man, that he must suffer many things, and be set at nought (Mark 9:12).

- **On the Road to Jerusalem at the Passover** (Mark 10:33-34)

The Nature of Jesus' Prophecies



- Specific Place – Jerusalem
- Specific People – Jews and Gentiles
- Specific Parties – chief priests and scribes
- Specific Progression – scope and sequence
- Specific Points on Persecution – spit, scourge
- Specific Plan – kill him
- Specific Periods of Time – three days
- Specific Promise – raised from the dead

II. THE PREDICTIONS OF SUFERING



- **Mark 10:33-34**
 - A. THE PLAN** – “Saying, Behold, we go up to Jerusalem”
 - B. THE PERSON** – “and the Son of man”
 - C. THE PARTICULARS (8 of them)**

#1 – “shall be delivered unto the chief priests, and unto the scribes;”



Mark 11:18,

And the scribes and chief priests heard it, and sought how they might destroy him: for they feared him, because all the people was astonished at his doctrine.

Mark 12:12,

And they sought to lay hold on him, but feared the people: for they knew that he had spoken the parable against them: and they left him, and went their way.

Mark 14:1,

After two days was the feast of the passover, and of unleavened bread: and the chief priests and the scribes sought how they might take him by craft, and put him to death.

Judas the Betrayer



- Mark 14:10,
And Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve, went unto the chief priests, to betray him unto them.
- Mark 14:18,
And as they sat and did eat, Jesus said, Verily I say unto you, One of you which eateth with me shall betray me.
- Mark 14:41,
And he cometh the third time, and saith unto them, Sleep on now, and take your rest: it is enough, the hour is come; behold, **the Son of man is betrayed** (Greek “*Delivered*”) into the hands of sinners.
- Mark 14:43,
And immediately, while he yet spake, cometh Judas, one of the twelve, and with him a great multitude with swords and staves, from **the chief priests and the scribes and the elders.**

#2 – “and they shall condemn him to death,”



- Mark 14:61,
But he held his peace, and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked him, and said unto him, Art thou the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?
- Mark 14:62,
And Jesus said, I am: and ye shall see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven.
- Mark 14:64,
Ye have heard the blasphemy: what think ye? **And they all condemned him to be guilty of death.**

#3 – “and shall deliver him to the Gentiles:”



- **Mark 15:1,**
And straightway in the morning the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council, and bound Jesus, and carried him away, **and delivered him to Pilate.**
- **Mark 15:10,**
For he knew that the chief priests **had delivered** him for envy.
- **Mark 15:15,**
And so Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, **and delivered Jesus,** when he had scourged him, to be crucified.

#4 – “And they shall mock him,”



Mark 14:65 – Mocked Him as a Prophet

And some began to spit at Him, and to blindfold Him, and to beat Him with their fists, and to say to Him, "Prophecy!" And the officers received Him with slaps in the face.

THEY MOCKED HIM AS A KING



Mark 15:17,

And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his head,

Mark 15:18,

And began to salute him, Hail, King of the Jews!

Mark 15:19,

And they smote him on the head with a reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing their knees worshipped him.

Mark 15:20,

And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple from him, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him.

They Mocked Him as the Messiah and Savior



- Mark 15:30,
Save thyself, and come down from the cross.
- Mark 15:31,
Likewise also the chief priests mocking said among themselves with the scribes, He saved others; himself he cannot save.
- Mark 15:32,
Let Christ the King of Israel descend now from the cross, that we may see and believe. And they that were crucified with him reviled him.

#5 – “and shall scourge him,”



Mark 15:15,

And so Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, and delivered Jesus, **when he had scourged him**, to be crucified.

#6 – “and shall spit upon him,”



Mark 14:65,

And some began to spit on him, and to cover his face, and to buffet him, and to say unto him, Prophecy: and the servants did strike him with the palms of their hands.

#7 – “and shall kill him:”



Mark 15:15,

And so Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, and delivered Jesus, when he had scourged him, **to be crucified.**

Mark 15:24,

And when they had crucified him, they parted his garments, casting lots upon them, what every man should take.

Mark 15:25,

And it was the third hour, **and they crucified him.**

Mark 15:37,

And Jesus cried with a loud voice, and gave up the ghost.

The Confession of the Centurion



- **Mark 15:39,**

And when the centurion, which stood over against him, saw that he so cried out, and gave up the ghost, he said, **Truly this man was the Son of God.**

#8 – “and the third day he shall rise again.”



- **Mark 16:9,**

Now when Jesus **was risen** early the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils.

III. THE PROMISE OF RESURRECTION



- “AND THE THIRD DAY HE SHALL RISE AGAIN.”
- **Romans 10:9,**
That if thou shalt **confess with thy mouth** the Lord Jesus, and shalt **believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead**, thou shalt be saved.

The Response of the Twelve

Before the death, burial and resurrection



- **Luke 18:34**

And they understood none of these things:
and this saying was hid from them,
neither knew they the things which were spoken.

The Response of the Twelve After the Death, Burial and Resurrection



- Luke 24:6,
He is not here, but is risen: remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galilee,
- Luke 24:7,
Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.
- Luke 24:8,
And they remembered his words,
